SUBJECT: Instructions for
Commencement Exercises

1. Commencement services will be conducted at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, May 23, in the Municipal Building. Seniors will march in and sit according to their assigned seats as listed on the attached page entitled "Stage - Middle Section." The seating of seniors will be controlled by the ushers. Those seniors who have a part in the program will come directly to the stage instead of going to their seats. After seniors have marched in, they will remain standing for the National Anthem and the invocation. All boys will remove their hats for the National Anthem and the invocation. Girls will not remove their hats.

The principal will present those seniors who will graduate with highest honors. This procedure will be done in the following manner. The principal will say, "Those students who are graduating with the highest honors, please come to the stage." At this time these students will go to the south wing of the stage and line up alphabetically. When their name is called, they will walk across the stage, receive their award and return to their seat.

All seniors will stand for presentation and acceptance. Diplomas will be presented in the following manner: seniors will stand one row at a time and approach the stage by the south exit (to your right). The ushers will control this movement. You will not walk on the stage until your name is called. When your name is called, walk onto the stage, receive your diploma from Mr. Reitemeier with your left hand crossing your right hand over your left to shake hands with Mr. Reitemeier. After receiving your diploma, you will continue to the north exit and stop where Mr. Martin is standing, and on his cue you will return to your seat together. Upon returning to your seats, you will remain standing until all students in your row are ready to be seated. You will not stand during the remainder of the diploma presentation ceremony.

Following the presentation of the diplomas, we will be ready for the recessional. Students will rise for the recessional on a cue from Mr. Standley and march out in an orderly fashion.

Note:

Students may retain tassels from caps. These were paid for in the rental price.

Honor students may buy honor cords for \$2 -- otherwise they must be returned to Mr. Perez following the exercises.
